









In celebration of Saint Andrew, the Patron Saint of Scotland, a Haggis Hunt is to be held on December 4th, 2019, from

At 6.30pm.

(West Richmond Station about 500 mtrs west on Highett St; Bridge Road trams about 200 mtrs south)

According to legend, St. Andrew became the patron saint of Scotland in 832 AD: an army of Scots was facing an English army when the Scottish king prayed to St. Andrew for help. Seeing a cloud in the shape of the saltire on which St Andrew had been crucified (X-shaped) against a clear blue sky, the king vowed that if the Scots were victorious, St. Andrew would be made the patron saint of Scotland. The Scots won the battle; the king fulfilled his promise; and the intervention of St. Andrew has been represented on the Scottish flag ever since. It is reputedly the oldest national flag in Europe. The saltire cross was later incorporated into the Union Flag of the UK, and the date of November 30th was chosen for Scots to celebrate the best of Scottish culture and cuisine....and to go on the annual haggis hunt!
